Water Carrying Challenge- Saint Joseph's Day



This is Thandolwayo, a 12-year-old-Zimbabwean girl who each morning walks 7km to a crocodile-infested river to fetch contaminated water to carry back to her village. Our students have been learning about Thandolwayo's story and the hardships she faces, just to ensure her village has the absolute basics of life. We learned how through fundraising, Caritas has been able to install a solar-powered water pump in her village. This has made a profound difference in the quality of life for all of the villagers.

Sadly, Thandolwayo's story is not unusual; there are people all over the world who face similar challenges. Here at Saint Joseph's we thought that as part of our Saint Joseph's day celebrations on Tuesday 19th March, we would do our bit to help the fundraising cause.

Students will participate in a 'Water Carrying Challenge', where they will walk laps of the oval carrying bottles of water. Your child will have brought home a sponsorship form. We are hopeful that the students will not only raise some money for a good cause, but also create a greater sense of empathy for the challenges faced by others.

Some other important details to remember for Tuesday:

- It is free dress. You might like to pack towel and/or spare clothes just in case any water is spilled.
- Hats- please make sure your child has a hat, or they won't be able to participate in the outdoor activities.
- Students will be provided with a free sausage sizzle lunch- this will replace the usual canteen menu.
- Tabloid activities- after lunch, students will form small groups for some tabloid activities. These activities have been organised by our Year 6 students.
- Saint Joseph's Day Mass-Wednesday 20th March 10.00am- all welcome. This Mass will be led by our Year 2/3 Class.

Easter Raffle


It's Easter raffle time! This is our first fundraising event for the year, and we need your help!

'Our PhotoStories' Workshops in Manjimup

The Shire of Manjimup Libraries, the Manjimup Photo Club and the Southern Forests Photography Club are collaborating to host a **two-part** Our PhotoStories photography workshop with Astrid Volzke in Manjimup in April/May 2019.

Part 1 of the Our PhotoStories workshop will teach photography enthusiasts how to create a photo story using their cameras (from digital SLR cameras to smartphones). It will focus on teaching different photography skills including portraiture, capturing action, wide-angle and close-up details, storytelling and more.
